You especially need to try our baklava cheesecake which is a unique recipe that is found only here in Pawtucket. It is the invention of our late parishioner Tina Georgitsis and will always be served in her memory. Be sure to stroll through our "Agora" (Greek marketplace) where you can find Greek trinkets as if you were in Athens or on the Greek Islands.

We hope you enjoy our Festival! We look forward to hosting you and hope you come again and again year after year!

May the Lord Jesus Christ protect you and yours through the intercessions of the Virgin Mary, the very Mother of God who is the patron saint of our beloved parish.

History of the Church

The Greek community in Pawtucket began somewhere near 1896 with six to ten young men who emigrated from Greece. They rented halls and houses to hold Divine Liturgy services whenever a priest was available.

By 1910, the community had grown to about 75 members. This small community raised a grand total of \$750 towards a church, and in 1911 property was bought on George Street for this purpose. (Present home of Hampton Inn).

The first Parish Council, consisting of seven members, was formed on February 22, 1912, at which time the Assumption Church received a religious corporation charter from the State of Rhode Island. In November 1912 the cornerstone was laid on the George Street site. On June 13, 1914, by-laws were written, and the church was given its official name, "Hellenic Orthodox Church of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary."


In 1925, the community purchased property on Armistice Boulevard (then known as Brook Street) as a cemetery for the church.

In 1952 the community bought 27 acres of land on River Road in Lincoln to be used for church outings. Urban Renewal displaced the George Street church, and on May 30, 1966, ground was broken at 97 Walcott Street, the former Ott Mansion. Services were held at the renovated chapel in the former carriage house on the property, and in January 1967 construction of the present church began. The Mansion House was renovated for offices and living quarters for the priest and his family. The parish grew to its present size of 350 families.

This year, as we celebrate our Annual Festival, we are thankful for our growth. We are a thriving parish. Our youngsters attend Sunday School and are enriched in our faith, and they learn the Greek language and culture at our Greek School. GOYA provides activities for our youth. We have a renowned Dance Troup. Our Philoptochos Society supports its church and many other philanthropies. We are a strong presence in the community, locally and regionally. In 2012 we proudly celebrated our 100th Anniversary. We are proud of our past and look forward to a prosperous future.
